

## EDITORIAL

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In this last edition of 2013, we would like to thank all the readers, authors, evaluators and members of the editorial board for their trust in the Public Administration and Social Management – APGS – Journal.

In order to qualify it and increase the visibility of the APGS Journal before the national and international scientific community, we are conducting ongoing actions to streamline the paper submission process and to adapt the format and the design for APGS editions according to the standards of international indexed journals.

Due to the actions of improving the quality of our publications, the APGS Journal increasingly is the subject of technical and scientific interest of many academics and practitioners from different regions of Brazil and the world, as made evident by our access statistics.

The first two articles in this issue discuss the violence in the public sphere. The first is on **Moral Harassment in the University: the Possible Consequences in Commenting and/or Reporting Violence**, by Thiago Soares Nunes and Susanna Rose Tolfo, both from the Federal University of Santa Catarina (UFSC). In this article, the authors noted the incipience of the working conditions and of the university management to deal with this form of psychological, social aggression.

The second article deals with the **Evaluation of the Implementation of the Educational Program for Drug and Violence Resistance in the State of Rio Grande do Norte**, by Andreza Sousa Santos, from the Federal Institute of Education, Science and Technology of Rio Grande do Norte (IFRN), and professors Richard Medeiros de Araújo, Keity Bezerra de Lira and Gilsemberg Gurgel Pinheiro, from FACEX University Center (UNIFACEX). These authors identified critical factors for the maintenance of such program that could be minimized if it were better discussed with the society or treated as a State policy.

**The Associative Work and its Management Difficulties for the Mothers of APAE Families** is the third article in this edition. Written by Luis André Aragão Frota, from the State University of Ceará (UECE), and by Joannes Paulus Silva Forte, from the State University of Vale do Acaraú (UVA), the article discusses the repercussion and the creation of the Special Families' Beneficent Association in the everyday life of its affiliates.

Authored by Rodrigo Burkowski, from the Federal University of Ouro Preto (UFOP), and Ana Alice Vilas Boas, from the Federal University of Lavras (UFLA), the article **Gift in the Management of Protected Areas: a Study on the Participation of Counselors of the Veredas-Peruaçu Mosaic, Brazil**, approaches the "donation" of members to the creation and maintenance of this board, which is responsible for the management, including the environmental management, of protected areas.

The fifth article discusses the **Level of Conformity with Accounting Disclosure Practices**, endorsed by the presentation standards for financial statements (CPC 26), which is practiced by community university foundations in the state of Santa Catarina. This paper was written by Itzhak David Simão Kaveski and Antonio M. da Silva Carpes, from the Regional University of Blumenau (FURB), and by Jorge Eduardo Scarpin, from the Federal University of Paraná (UFPR).

As the teaching case in the field of social management for this edition, we chose the paper entitled **Between Equity and Solidarity: Rethinking the Remuneration of the Cooperators**, authored by Airton Cardoso Cançado and Liliam Deisy Ghizoni, from the Federal University of Tocantins (UFT), Naldeer dos Santos Vieira, from the Federal University of the Jequitinhonha Valley and Mucuri (UFVJM), and by Ariádne Scalfoni Rigo, from the Federal University of Bahia (UFBA).
